In October 2024, SMIMS commemorated Breast Cancer Awareness and Prevention Month. We organized a 30-day celebration with a variety of events, such as awareness talks, art exhibits, educational sessions, and free camps with an emphasis on Tamilnadu and Kerala.

The schedule for the program is included below

1.Inauguration on 3rd October

The inauguration took place on the 3rd of October in front of the hospital, marking the official start of the event. The venue, set against the backdrop of the hospital, provided a meaningful setting for the occasion, as patients, staff, and guests gathered to celebrate the beginning of the program. "The program was addressed by CEO Dr.Mookambika R V, Dr.Jayakumar, Head Radiation oncology, Dr.Chandramohan .Head surgical Dr.Kannan Dean Medical oncology college and Dr.Sonymol COO SMIMS, "We kicked off the month-long program with a symbolic balloon launch, where our patients took part in the uplifting ceremony. 4. Camp: Breast Cancer awareness and NCD screening camp, Melpuram, Kulithurai

The camp aimed to raise awareness about breast cancer. educate attendees on self-examination techniques, and provide crucial information on the importance of regular screenings. In addition to breast cancer, the camp also offered screening services for various non-communicable diseases such as diabetes, hypertension, and cardiovascular conditions. This initiative was a vital step in encouraging community members to prioritize their health and take preventive measures against these conditions."





Two doctors from TOT (Dr.Deepika.K and Dr.Annie S Raj have attended the free camp along with two nurses (Ajmi and Lydia) and 15 other healthcare workers.. "The camp saw a total footfall of 78 participants, with 40 women attending the breast cancer awareness session. These women, as beneficiaries of the camp, actively engaged in the educational talk on breast health and prevention. Following the awareness session, all 40 women underwent breast screening, ensuring they received both the knowledge and the necessary preventive care measures to safeguard their health."

Total footfall of the camp was 192, 75 females are attended the camp and underwent the breast examination. Awareness session on breast health was given by TOT Doctor and Nurse.






7.Data collection of research

"A comprehensive proforma has been developed and implemented for data collection as part of a research study focused on assessing knowledge, practices, and attitudes towards breast cancer prevention, early detection, and awareness. The study aims to gauge the impact of educational interventions on these areas. Both pre-test and post-test questionnaires have been distributed by the 'Training of Trainers' (TOT) trainees and doctors involved in community outreach programs. By comparing the results before and after the training sessions, the study seeks to evaluate the effectiveness of the programs in enhancing the participants' understanding and ability to promote breast cancer awareness in their communities."

8.Wall of Pink

"The 'Wall of Pink' is a symbolic initiative aimed at raising awareness for breast cancer. This visually impactful display is designed to honour survivors, remember those lost, and encourage solidarity in the fight against breast cancer. "For two days, the hospital was illuminated in pink light to mark its commitment to breast cancer awareness. The pink lighting served as a symbol of solidarity with breast cancer patients and survivors, creating a striking visual reminder of the importance of early detection and prevention.
